Did you know that the city issues Temporary Business Licenses for certain business operations?

Remember that:

One act constitutes doing business, this includes:

- ★ Selling goods or services within the city
- ★ Soliciting business within the city
- → Displaying signs that offer goods or services
- ♦ Using any vehicle or premises in the city in business resulting in profit.

Temporary Licenses are required for any business within city limits, including pop-up shops, event vendors, and door-to-door sales.

Exemptions include:

- → "Garage Sales"
- ★ Leasing or renting fewer than two separate units, spaces or parcels of property
- → Delivery within the city from businesses outside the city
- + Home or personal care
- **♦** Non-profits
- → Part-time babysitting, nursery or child-care
- → Intermittent/Casual employee rendering services to a household Contractor/Landscape Contractor with a state license and business located outside the city

A license can be issued for 6 months or less for a fee of \$25.

Please contact City Hall if you need to report an unlicensed transient merchant or door-to-door representative so we can reach out and supply directions to obtain a temporary business license.
