

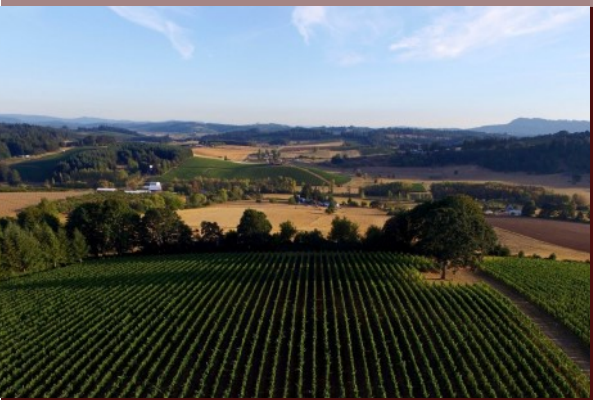

Water

- Annual dam inspection was completed and all is in good working order

Sewer

- Headworks project is almost complete! The final inspection will occur within the next two weeks
- There was a sewer force main break last Friday that turned into a Sanitary System overflow with sewer effluent entering Hawn Creek. The repair was completed on Friday and it was found to be caused by a severed welded joint on the 6" steel line. DEQ, ORS, and Viola water Wilsonville were contacted, along with the News Register

Parks

- All parks in Carlton are open
- Last Saturday's Easter egg hunt put on by the Carlton Fire Department was a huge success!
- Baseball season is here and teams will begin practicing/playing at Wennerberg Park—please remember to keep your dogs off of the ball fields and clean up after them
