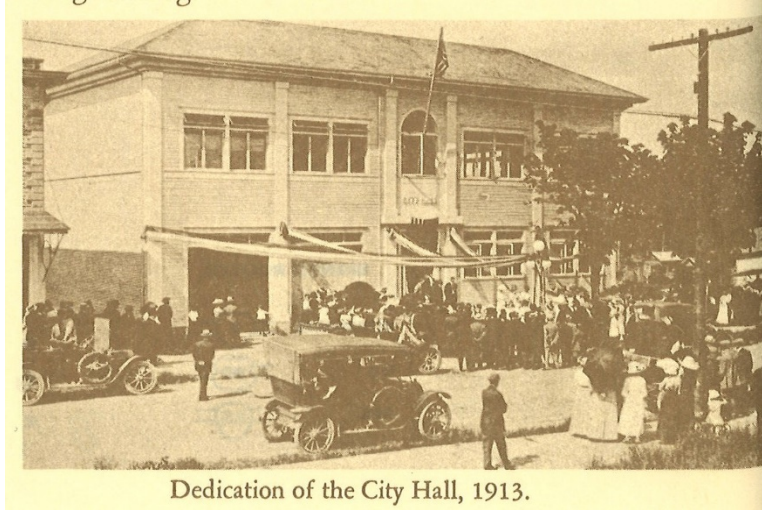

Police

- **Newest Member of the Carlton Police Department**

- **Three members of the Carlton Police Department staff have received their first set of COVID vaccination shots.**
- **There have been 117 service calls as of January 19, 2021.**
- **There are nine written case reports as of January 19. This includes reports of child internet exploitation, domestic harassment, agency assist juvenile neglect, verbal domestic, two thefts, stolen vehicle, trespass, and credit card fraud.**



Public Works

- Wennerberg Park will soon be having a new playground; the contract for the site preparation is finalized and will be weather dependent for construction.
- Public Works completed the second bypass at the lagoons of roughly 8 million gallons to make room for any future rain events.

- City of Carlton names new City Manager



Shannon Beaucaire, the current city manager for the City of Yachats, Oregon, has been selected as the new city manager for the City of Carlton.

The selection completes an extensive search process that began last fall with the city's retention of Portland-based Jensen and Associates Strategies consulting. Thirty-three applicants responded to the initial opening announcement. Four finalists participated in the week-long series of virtual receptions and in-person interviews, culminating with the mayor and Carlton City Council's final decision.

Ms. Beauciare has been City Manager of Yachats since 2017 and has 12 years of local and state government management experience. Previously she was Statewide Manager for the State of New Mexico Supreme Court and a Division Manager for the City of Albuquerque Legal Department. She holds a Juris Doctorate from the Northwestern School of Law, Lewis and Clark College, Portland, Oregon. Her specializations are environmental & natural resources law and alternative dispute

resolution. She obtained her Bachelor of Science degree from Michigan State University.

"This wasn't a simple process or an easy decision," said Carlton Mayor Linda Watkins. "Jensen Strategies brought us a number of very qualified candidates, and those folks went through a series of intensive interviews with neighboring city managers, city staff and department heads and city residents as well as the city council. Shannon's small-town experience, background in the law, and certification in Alternative Dispute Resolution will be great attributes as our city confronts various challenges this year. We're excited to welcome her to Carlton."

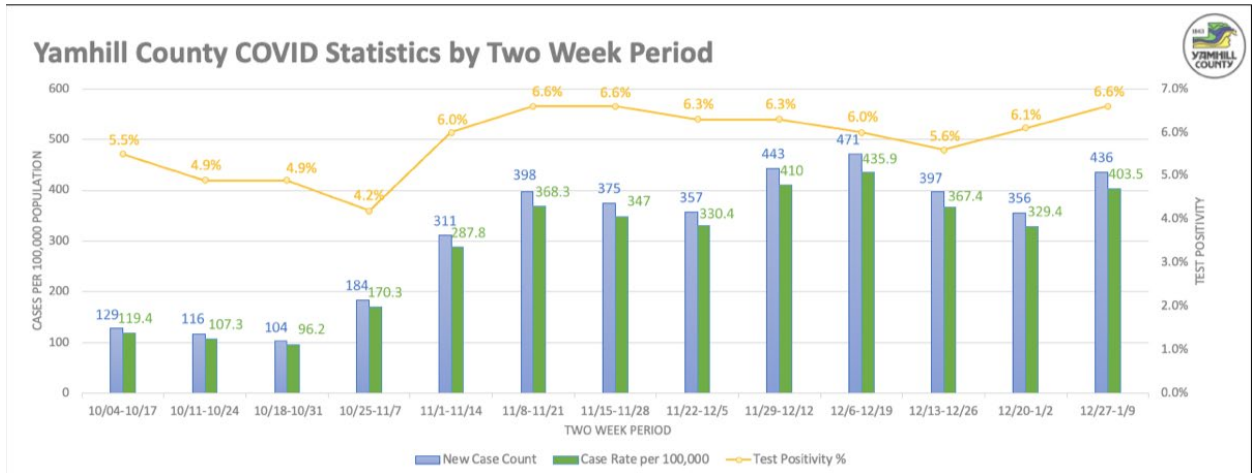
The City Attorney will begin contract negotiations this week. A start date has yet to be determined.

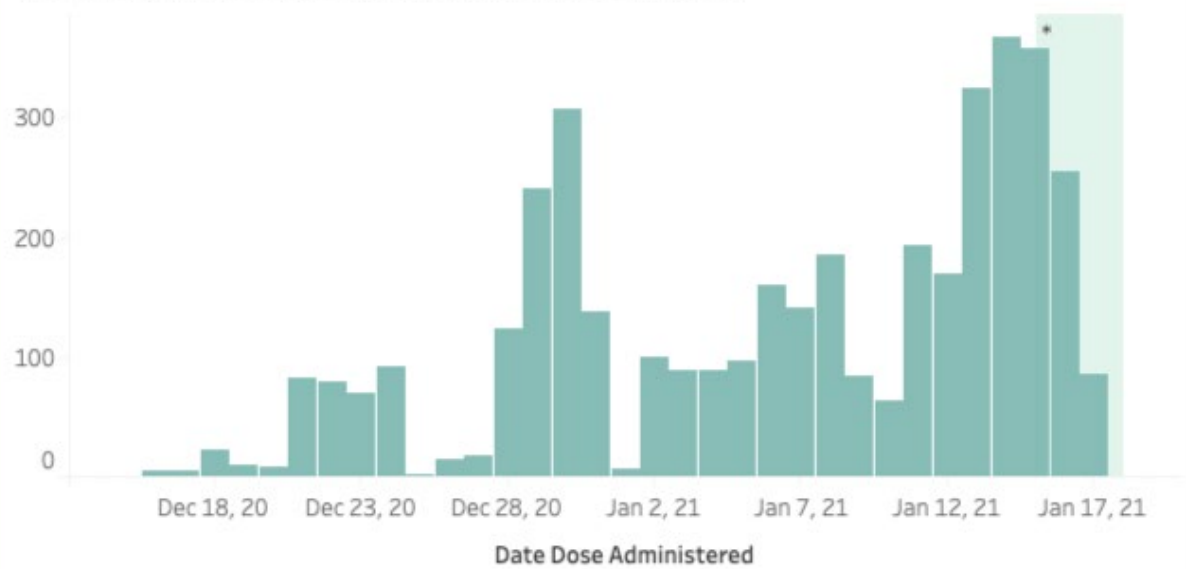

Phase 1A

Everyone in Phase 1, Groups 1,2,3 and 4 are currently eligible for the vaccine.

Group 1

- Hospitals
- Urgent Care
- Skilled nursing and memory care facility healthcare personnel (HCP) and residents
- Tribal health programs
- Emergency medical services (EMS) providers and other first responders
- Health care interpreters
- Traditional health workers

Group 2

- Other long-term care facilities, including HCP and residents of:
 - Residential care facilities
 - Adult foster care
 - Group homes for people with intellectual and developmental disabilities
 - Other congregate care sites

- Hospice programs
- Mobile crisis care and related services
- Individuals working in a correctional setting

Group 3

- HCPs in outpatient settings serving specific high-risk groups
- Day treatment services
- Non-emergency medical transport (NEMT)
- Caregivers of medically fragile children or adults who live at home

Group 4

- All other outpatient HCPs
- Public health sites

Phase 1B, 1C and Phase 2

Who's getting vaccinated in Oregon next

Child-care, preschool and K-12 school and school district staff will be in the first group of Phase 1B.

Subsequent groups in Phase 1B and beyond will be determined by the Vaccine Advisory Committee and shared on OHA's COVID-19 vaccine web page. These are examples of groups of people who may included:

- Critical workers in high-risk settings — workers who are in industries essential to the functioning of society and substantially higher risk of exposure
- People in prisons, jails, detention centers, and similar facilities, and staff who work in such settings
- All older adults not included in Group 1A
- General population
- People of all ages with underlying conditions that put them at moderately higher risk

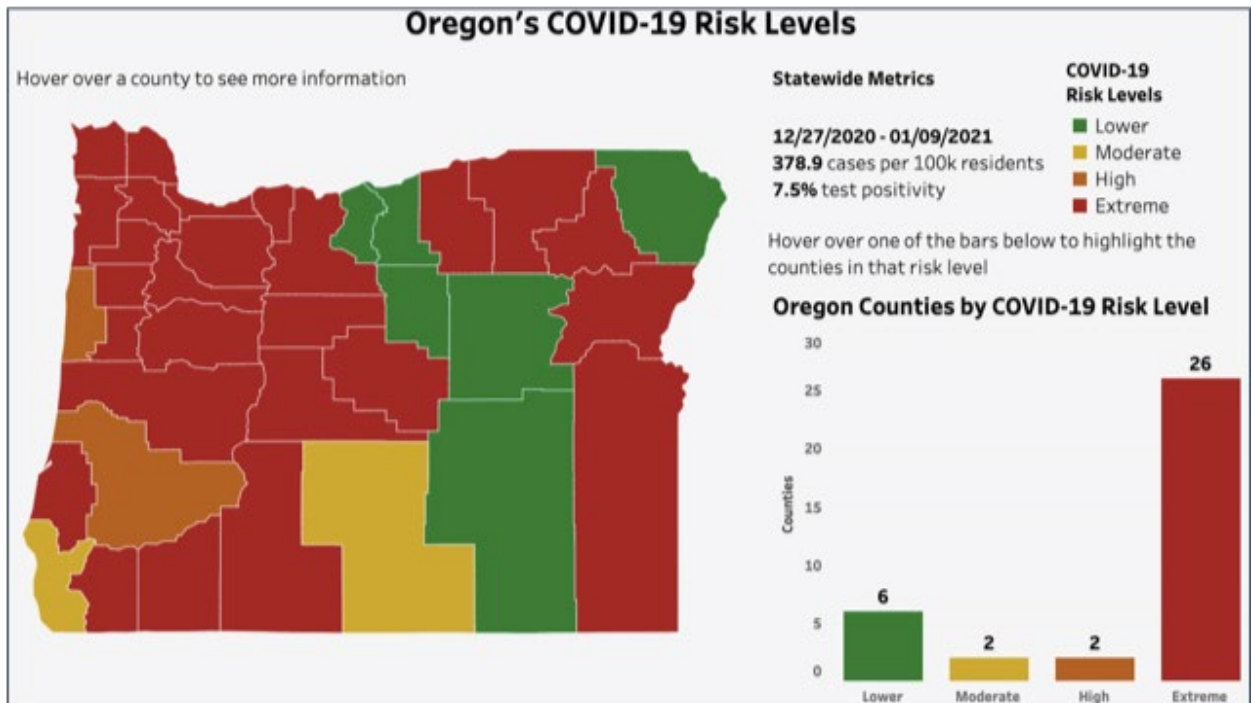
Yamhill County is currently in the **Extreme** Risk Level.
