Dayton teen faces rape charges

A Dayton teenager is accused of rape and sexual assault in two separate cases, with a third case being investigated.

Carlton police arrested 18-year-old Cameron McCready of Dayton last month, alleging he forced himself on his younger victim during a party at an East Main Street residence in which the attendees were playing drinking games, according to court records. The victim reportedly became sick and blacked out at one time.

During a Juliette's House interview, the victim said McCready held her down by the neck with his hand, told her to "shut the (expletive) up" and that he would kill her if she told anyone what he had done, a probable cause affidavit states.

McCready initially denied having sex with the victim but later said they did have consensual sex.

Following that arrest, the Yamhill County Sheriff's Office took a report from the mother of a different minor girl who alleged McCready sexually assaulted her.

The father of that victim later told the sheriff's office his daughter had not told her mother everything that happened because she was too embarrassed.

The mother and father learned she was having a relationship with McCready a few months earlier when McMinnville police brought her home after she was found with him violating curfew.

The sheriff's office alleges in a probable cause statement the victim said she was confronted by McCready in the bedroom of a Dayton residence and was forced to have sex with him.

She said at one time she was "seized by the throat" and pushed down on a bed. She said she stopped resisting because she did not want to get hurt.

It was hard to breathe and she was gasping for air while being strangled, according to the statement. "Everything was forced," she reported.

The sheriff's office also said it is investigating another sexual assault allegation targeting McCready in which the female victim said he strangled her while she said she was being raped.

In the Carlton police case, McCready has been indicted by a grand jury on two counts each of first-degree rape and first-degree sexual abuse and one count each of first-degree sexual abuse, third-degree rape and fourth-degree assault. He has elected to take the case to trial at 9 a.m. Tuesday, May 25. The proceeding is scheduled to last two or three days.

McCready has been charged by the sheriff's office with two counts each of first-degree rape, first-degree sexual abuse and strangulation in addition to one count of first-degree unlawful sexual penetration. McCready will be arraigned on an indictment in circuit court at 1:30 p.m. Wednesday, March 31.

Those 14 counts are primarily Class A, B and C felonies, many of which are Measure 11 charges, subject to mandatory minimum prison sentences.

McCready is lodged in local custody on \$425,000 bail.
