## Public Works

### ***Water Projects***

### **Extra Patrol Addressing speeding vehicles, cell phones, stop signs, and crosswalk violations.**

The Carlton Police Department conducted a focused patrol with four officers specifically addressing speeding, stop signs, crosswalks, and cell phone violations. This specific enforcement effort area was E. Main St., West Main St., S. Pine St., and Scott and Monroe St. As a result of the focused patrol yielded the following:

S. Pine St. – 4 – speeding citations, 3- warnings, 1 – no driver license

E. Main St. – 3 – speeding citations, 3 – warnings

W. Main St. – 1 – speeding citations, 3 – cell phone citations, 2 – Failure to obey traffic control device

- The Planning Commission approved 156 E Monroe St (Brooklyn Terrace) on April 19.



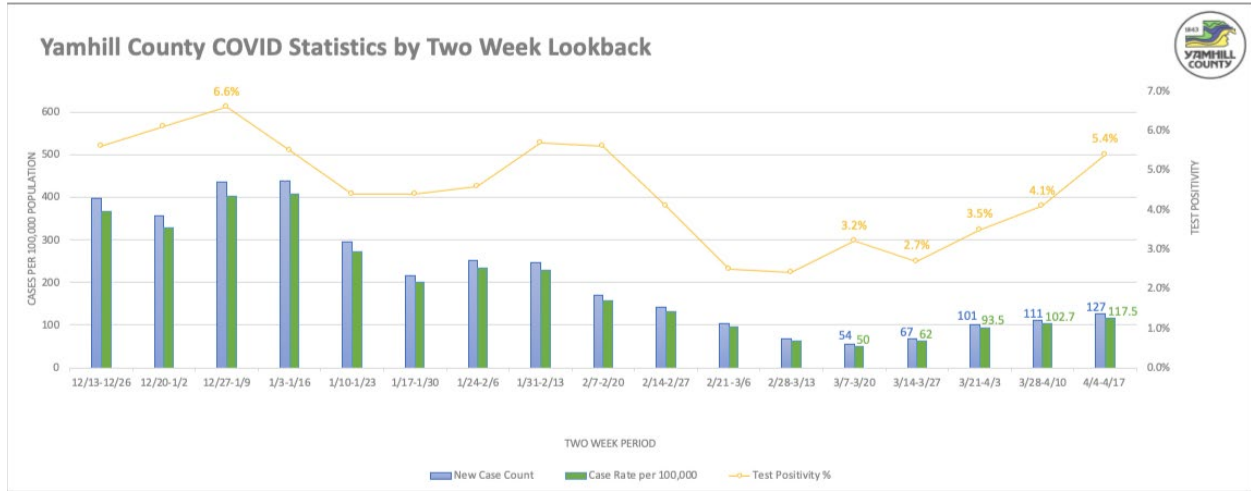
