


# City Community Updates

## **Public Works**

#### Water/Sewer

The Meadowlake transmission line project is on schedule has completed over 19,000 feet of replacement line and we are on schedule to finish in November 2021.

This project will replace 32,435 feet (6.14 miles) of water transmission pipeline. Trenchline Excavation is doing the project. The City received a grant for \$7,150,000 for this project which was to cover all aspects of the work including engineering, permitting, construction and change orders. The City is also entering an agreement with Yamhill County to share a portion of the paving cost for the project and some service line work and reservoir sealing will also be completed.



The Panther Creek dredging project has begun! The silt filters are almot complete and dredging started this week.

On August 25, 2021 a Juvenile was arrested for Felony Domestic Assault and lodged in the Yamhill County Juvenile Detention Center.


#### Total CADS Reports for August 1st thru August 26th



## Yamhill County Health Providers: Follow guidelines for controlling spread of COVID-19

Yamhill County Public Health, Willamette Valley Medical Center and Providence Newberg Medical Center are urging the public, including local businesses and workers, to follow established guidelines for controlling the spread of COVID-19.

As new infection numbers surge due to the Delta variant, it's vital that people who are experiencing COVID symptoms, or believe they have been exposed to the virus, practice proper isolation and quarantine to help prevent spreading the illness to others.

#### If you are unvaccinated or partially vaccinated and have had contact with a positive case:

- Isolate at home for a minimum of 10 days.
- If you develop symptoms (cough, fever, chills), call 971-326-8718 for information on testing. If symptoms are severe (difficulty breathing, becoming confused or especially hard to wake, persistent chest pain, or developing bluish lips/face), go to a hospital emergency room or call 9-1-1.

#### If you are vaccinated and have had contact with a positive case:

- There is no need to isolate at home unless you develop symptoms.
- If you develop symptoms (cough, fever, chills), call 971-326-8718 for information on testing.

For a complete list of guidance on isolation and testing, go to www.co.yamhill.or.us.

Due to the surge in cases and demands on local hospitals, people are urged not to go to urgent care clinics or hospitals to be tested. Hospital resources must be reserved for the sick and injured. It's important to remember that Yamhill County hospitals have visitation restrictions in place and to check with the hospital prior to visiting.

People who report to work with confirmed or potential COVID infections risk spreading the illness to fellow workers and customers.

Your local health care providers remind all residents that the best defense against the illness is vaccination, which is available from multiple providers.
