# **Public Works**

### Water

- ➤ Panther Creek Reservoir Dredging Project is in the road improvement phase of the project with Trenchline acting as the subcontractor for the Panther creek reservoir general contractor installing rock and 2 culverts.
- Concrete reservoir lining portion of the project has been installed and final wrap up items are being worked on by the contractor
- We had a water leak repair at the American Legion Hall



**Meadowlake Transmission line** 

- Mainline pipe installation on the Meadow lake transmission line project is complete!
- Approximately 7,400 feet of one lane along Meadowlake Road has been paved. The shoulder rock along Panther Creek Road has been partially installed.
- The remaining project items, like water service installation, are scheduled to finish in November/December. Approximately ½ of the line from water plant to concrete reservoir is online with all new water pipe.



This project will replace 32,435 feet (6.14 miles) of water transmission pipeline. Trenchline Excavation is doing the project. The City received a grant for \$7,150,000 for this project which was to cover all aspects of the work including engineering, permitting, construction and change orders.

### Sewer

➤ One Sewer lateral repair at N. 2<sup>nd</sup> and Madison Street was completed.

### Parks/Pool

- Over the weekend, vandalism occurred with the cutting of the rose bushes at the pool. There is an active investigation
- Lower park is tentatively scheduled to close its gates by the end of October
- > The historic street sign has been repaired and reinstalled
- The City is reviewing the work on the Park in JR Meadows 1

### Streets

- Sidewalk project on Monroe St. is about 60% complete due to setbacks due to weather conditions
- ➤ We are having ongoing meetings and conversations with ODOT about required replacement of ADA ramps. We are working with them to obtain a schedule that minimizes disruptions to businesses
- ➤ We have worked with ODOT to extend the speed zone on the south end of Highway 47. The 30MPH zone will extend south approximately another 500 feet

Another example of the Carlton Police Department building partnerships with our lil future community policing professionals!


### <u>Arrests</u>



In November of 1949 the last of a long string of sawmills to operate on the Carlton Lake was built






Lumber carriers used in the yards of the L.H.L. mill.
