Public Works

<u>Water</u>

- ➤ Panther Creek Reservoir Dredging Project is in the road improvement phase. The road upgrade is to start next week.
- Concrete reservoir is full and awaiting testing results before being put into service



Meadowlake Transmission line

Mainline pipe installation on the Meadow lake transmission line project is complete!

Approximately 7,400 feet of one lane along Meadowlake Road has been paved. The shoulder rock along Panther Creek Road has been installed. We are working to connect properties to the new Mainline.



The remaining project items, like water service installation, are scheduled to finish in November/December.

Approximately ½ of the line from water plant to concrete reservoir is online with all new water pipe.

This project will replace 32,435 feet (6.14 miles) of water transmission pipeline. Trenchline Excavation is doing the project. The City received a grant for \$7,150,000 for this project which was to cover all aspects of the work including engineering, permitting, construction and change orders.

<u>Sewer</u>

➤ One Sewer repair on Madison and 2nd Street

Parks/Pool

➤ Wennerberg Park roadway is closed to vehicles for the season.

<u>Streets</u>


- Sidewalk project on Monroe St. is about 90% complete due to setbacks due to weather conditions
- ➤ We are having ongoing meetings and conversations with ODOT about required replacement of ADA ramps. We are working with them to obtain a schedule that minimizes disruptions to businesses

CRIME PREVENTION PROGRAMS

Lock It Or Lose It Prevention Program

The Carlton, Oregon Police Department has adopted a new program entitled, "LOCK IT or LOSE IT". The intent of the program is to promote awareness in hopes of eliminating thefts from automobiles occurring in the City of Carlton and surrounding area. The Carlton Police Department, as do all law enforcement agencies across the country, periodically conduct theft investigations from vehicles that seem to come in waves throughout certain periods of the year. Many of the thefts are from vehicles that were left unlocked. Items taken in these quickly committed crimes range from spare change to wallets, personal/business documents, electronics, and firearms

In most, if not all instances, these crimes can be prevented by simply locking car doors, assuring all the windows are completely shut, removing all valuable items or what might be perceived as containing valuables such as backpacks or other bags, keeping change and charging cords out of sight, and NEVER leave keys inside the vehicle.

Getting in the mindset of locking doors to your home, garages, and vehicles is the first step of minimizing the chance of becoming a crime victim.


