Public Works Meadowlake Transmission Line

Trenchline Excvation has replaced 32,435 feet (6.14 miles) of water transmission pipeline. Approximately 90 feet of ductile iron pipe has been installed. The contractor completed the ductile iron pipe installation along the overland easement and switched the water supply from the bypass line to the ductile iron line.

We need your Input!

Oregon is required to establish Total Maximum Daily Loads (TMDL) for streams segments which do not meet water quality standards. The TMDL identifies the level of pollutants that a water body can absorb and still meet water quality standards.

The City of Carlton has both the Yamhill river and Hawn Creek near and through it. It is important to keep these waterways clean where fish and wildlife use and depend on. The City will soon begin developing our own Water Quality Management plan and we need your input. If you could spare a few moments of time and share your thoughts, we would appreciate your time and responses.



Theft Prevention Safety Tips

This is the time of year L/E and communities see an increase in theft crimes. These thefts often occur during the early morning hours between 2 a.m. and 5 a.m. The Carlton Police Department would like to share the following prevention information regarding our "LOCK IT or LOSE IT program.

Lock It or Lose It Campaign. The Carlton, Oregon Police Department reminds citizens about its "LOCK IT or LOSE IT" program. The intent

of the program is to promote awareness in hopes of eliminating thefts of vehicles as well as property being stolen from automobiles occurring in the City of Carlton and surrounding area.

The Carlton Police Department, as do all law enforcement agencies across the country, periodically conduct theft investigations from vehicles that seem to come in waves throughout certain periods of the year. Many of the thefts are from vehicles that were left unlocked. Items taken in these quickly committed crimes range from spare change to wallets, personal/business documents, electronics, and firearms


In most, if not all instances, these crimes can be prevented by simply locking car doors, assuring all the windows are completely shut, removing all valuable items or what might be perceived as containing valuables such as backpacks or other bags, keeping change and charging cords out of sight, and NEVER leave keys inside the vehicle.

Getting in the mindset of locking doors to your home, garages, and vehicles is the first step of minimizing the chance of becoming a crime victim.

Carlton Police Department has "LOCK IT or LOSE IT" yard signs available for residents to display in their yard if they would like to help encourage a strong community prevention mindset. This program supports the mission of the Carlton Police Department's dedication to the community by proactively solving problems and protecting life and property through education and prevention. "Police & Community Together", can and will make our community safer and more livable.

Please be aware of your surroundings and report any suspicious activity immediately to your local law enforcement agency.
