<u>Water</u>

- Coastal Contractors is sandblasting interior of the clear well water tank. We have found corrosion build up that will require additional labor
- Paving on Meadow Lake Road scheduled to be completed March 25th

<u>Sewer</u>

- Hawn Creek pumpstation upgrade to begin mobilizing April 1st
- Engineering work continuing at the sewer treatment facility is continuing

Parks & Construction

- Hawn Creek Park Shelter construction should start by end of April
- The road at Wennerberg Park will open as soon as it dries
- Community Home builders working on street grades. Water & Sewer has been installed

The Carlton Code Corner

The City of Carlton has a set of ordinances that apply to our animal friends: pets and livestock.

- Animals are not to be allowed "at large". An animal at large means the animal or fowl is off the premises of the owner or caregiver and not under their immediate control
- Animals and fowl may not roam freely on streets or other public ways of the city nor be an injury or annoyance to others
- Owners and caregivers are not to allow animals to make excessive noise
- An operator of a vehicle must stop and aid an animal if struck, if the animal is killed you must attempt to determine the owner and inform them of the occurrence
- Citizens may not discharge any projectiles at nongame birds to injure or kill
- It is unlawful to overwork, deprive of sustenance or beat any animal



ADA curb ramps Construction in 2022

ODOT is installing ADA compliant curb ramps on the corners of several intersections in Carlton. ODOT plans to construct one corner of an intersection at a time, with up to five intersections under construction at once. When construction starts, expect ODOT crews working during the day and at night as needed. During construction, the project webpage or <u>Tripcheck.com</u> will have the most up to date information about impacts. OR 47 realignment design is underway

You may see activity in Carlton as ODOT restarts the design of the OR 47 realignment project. This project includes installing ADA curb ramps, bike lanes and rerouting traffic to a new alignment of OR 47 from W Main Street onto Monroe Street.
