Walk Around Town With The Chief

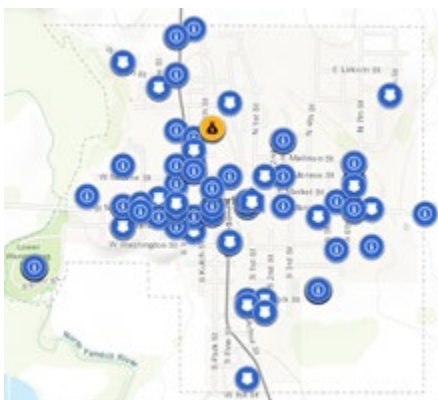

The Carlton Code Corner

As we gear up for spring planting and outdoor fun, let's take a look at how the city regulates water charges and equipment maintenance:

- ◆ Leaks between the meter and building are the responsibility of the owner for repair and detection,
- ◆ Customer accounts may be eligible for a partial consumption credit if a leak is repaired within 10 days of detection or notification.
- ◆ Water may be shut off without notice for repairs, though the city will strive to give at least 12 hours' notice
- ◆ Water may not be resold or distributed to any person or place other than to that which the service is provided
- ◆ Customers are responsible for all equipment and private lines necessary for receiving, controlling, applying and utilizing water; they city is not responsible for loss or damage to the equipment or lines
- ◆ Water rates are established by city council via resolution and cover the cost of system operation, maintenance, debt retirement and capital replacement
- ◆ Property owners of record are responsible for payment of water service charges

Many of us are heading outside to begin our gardening endeavors; let's review the City Ordinances for the maintenance of trees and vegetation.

- ⇒ All vegetation must conform to clear vision standards allowing for pedestrians and vehicles to navigate sidewalks and streets safely.
- ⇒ Owners and residents may not permit the accumulation of any grass, weeds and other *noxious vegetation more than ten (10) inches in height, and all dead bushes, grass, trees, debris and other things of an inflammable character on such property.
- ⇒ Lawn maintenance equipment is exempt from noise level regulations when it is in proper operating condition and operated at a reasonable time and duration.
- ⇒ It shall be unlawful for any person maliciously or wantonly to cut down, destroy, or injure any flower, bush, shrub, or tree standing or grown upon the property of another.
- ⇒ Trees must be trimmed to the trunk at least eight (8) feet over walks and pedestrian paths, and to a minimum height of fifteen (15) feet over streets and vehicular traffic areas.
- ⇒ Property owners shall maintain and keep in repair **planting strips in the public rights-of-way of the city that are in front of, adjacent to, or abutting upon the property,
- ⇒ Maintenance of planting strips includes mowing the grass regularly and periodic pruning of all plantings and trees located within the planting strip to avoid encroachment on the adjacent sidewalks and roadway

** "Planting strip" means the portion of area between a private property line and the curb or edge of pavement or traveled way which is not improved by a sidewalk.

ADA curb ramps Construction in 2022

ODOT is installing ADA compliant curb ramps on the corners of several intersections in Carlton. ODOT plans to construct one corner of an intersection at a time, with up to five intersections under construction at once. When construction starts, expect ODOT crews working during the day and at night as needed. During construction, the project webpage or Tripcheck.com will have the most up to date information about impacts.
