Carlton History

In May of 1940, a fire which broke out from sparks caused by friction, destroyed the Carlton Manufacturing Company plant. The sawmill and planing mill units were totally destroyed. All that was left of the mill were charred timbers, twisted machinery, and a \$50,000 loss to the community. (Reflections of Carlton, Pg. 80, 1975)

The Carlton Code Corner

As citizens and visitors alike begin to wander downtown to some of our favorite local businesses, please keep the city ordinances in mind to ensure safety:

- Do not obstruct building entrances, stairways or halls
- Do not drive vehicles over sidewalks, unless there is an entrance ramp, incline or crossing provided for that purpose
- ❖ Do not obstruct sidewalks or street crossings with objects or with groups of people
- ❖ It is unlawful to sell goods without a permit approved and issued by the City of Carlton
- ❖ Do not litter on the sidewalks, streets, parking, drinking fountains or in any public place; please use provided receptacles

And remember to keep vegetation trimmed for everyone's safety



- All vegetation must conform to clear vision standards allowing for pedestrians and vehicles to navigate sidewalks and streets safely.
- Owners and residents may not permit the accumulation of any grass, weeds and other noxious vegetation more than ten (10) inches in height, and all dead bushes, grass, trees, debris and other things of an inflammable character on such property.
- Trees must be trimmed to the trunk at least eight (8) feet over walks and pedestrian paths, and to a minimum height of fifteen (15) feet over streets and vehicular traffic areas.
- Property owners shall maintain and keep in repair planting strips in the public rights-of-way of the city that are in front of, adjacent to, or abutting upon the property,
- Maintenance of planting strips includes mowing the grass regularly and periodic pruning of all plantings and trees located within the planting strip to avoid encroachment on the adjacent sidewalks and roadway

ADA curb ramps Construction in 2022

ODOT is installing ADA compliant curb ramps on the corners of several intersections in Carlton. ODOT plans to construct one corner of an intersection at a time, with up to five intersections under construction at once. When construction starts, expect ODOT crews working during the day and at night as needed. During construction, the project webpage or Tripcheck.com will have the most up to date information about impacts. OR 47 realignment design is underway
