At the May 3, 2022 City Council Meeting, the City Council:

- ✓ Completed most of the Charter review update work
- ✓ Reviewed, and approved, Recology's proposed rate increase due to inflation costs. Approved a subscription recycling for yard debris and glass
- ✓ Considered, but did not approve, a request by Community Home Builders for SDC reduction for 12 homes for 10 years or more
- ✓ Approved a summer reading performance at the amphitheater in Wennerberg Park on Monday, June 27th at 2PM
- ✓ Approved Special Event Applications for Carlton Fun Days (June 24&25), Music for Hope (Aug 20) and National Night Out (August 2)
- ✓ Approved an E. Main Street Improvement Project Bid
- ✓ Approved a change order to the Water Plant Upgrade project to address corrosion
- ✓ Approved change orders for the transmission line project to replace the pipe between the concrete and steel reservoirs and address a drainage issue
- ✓ Approved the RFP Committee selection for a municipal judge and governmental affairs consulting
- ✓ Approved moving forward on a grant application for the Transportation System Plan update

ADA curb ramps Construction in JUNE 2022

ODOT is installing ADA compliant curb ramps on the corners of several intersections in Carlton. ODOT plans to construct one corner of an intersection at a time, with up to five intersections under construction at once. When construction starts, expect ODOT crews working during the day and at night as needed. During construction, the project webpage or Tripcheck.com will have the most up to date information about impacts.
