Water

- Meadow lake transmission line change order for section of pipe between concrete reservoir and steel reservoir are about 3 weeks out on materials

Carlton Code Corner

We've been seeing an explosion of flowers, trees and grass as the growing season is in full swing. As a reminder for our homes and properties:

- * Please remove used, or second-hand material such as bottles, metal, furniture, tires, bicycles, mattresses, motor vehicles or their parts, which are rendered practically useless for their original purpose and would be commonly classed as junk or secondhand goods on private property.
- * Please maintain landscaping by avoiding the accumulation of grass, weeds and other noxious vegetation, living or dead, of an inflammable nature on private property
- * Trim trees to the trunk 8 feet over walks (right of way) areas and 15 feet over streets/traffic areas
- * Please remember that property owners adjacent to/abutting or in front of planting strips and right of way areas are responsible for maintenance, this means mowing grass, removing weeds and keeping sidewalks and right of way areas clear of obstructions.

Code Enforcement would also like to help citizens remain in compliance with the following guidelines for RVs and Trailer Houses as per City Code.



What is permitted:

- ⇒ A Recreational Vehicle or Trailer House for a period up to 72 hours on public streets is permitted. After the 72 hours expire, the vehicle or trailer must be moved. Failure to do so may result in citation or towing.
- ⇒ Recreational Vehicles or Trailer Houses can be parked on private property for an indefinite amount of time if the vehicle or trailer doesn't cause any obstruction of sight and no one lives in it.
- ⇒ Camping in a recreational vehicle or trailer house on private property on a temporary base must be approved by the City of Carlton with a **Temporary Trailer Parking Permit**.

What is NOT permitted:

- Overnight sleeping or living in Recreational Vehicles and Trailer Houses on Public Streets **at any time**
- Permanent camping/living in a Recreational Vehicle or Trailer House on private property is not permitted
- Yard areas adjacent to a street are not to be used for the permanent storage of utility trailers, house or vacation trailers

ADA curb ramps Construction in **JUNE 2022**

ODOT is installing ADA compliant curb ramps on the corners of several intersections in Carlton. ODOT plans to construct one corner of an intersection at a time, with up to five intersections under construction at once. When construction starts, expect ODOT crews working during the day and at night as needed.

During construction, the project webpage or Tripcheck.com will have the most up to date information about impacts. ODOT is working with the City to help coordinate and distribute information and project updates.
