At the July 5, 2022 City Council Meeting, the City Council:

- ✓ Received updates on the E. Main Street sidewalk project, YCTC Community Center, and progress and next steps on the Comprehensive Plan update
- ✓ Approved the ordinance updating the City Charter – The City’s charter has many provisions that were outdated or invalidated by legislation over the last 16 years. The Council used the League of Oregon Cities Model Charter and removed unneeded provisions, improve clarity, and define roles and powers of the City more clearly. This will be on the November ballot.
- ✓ Approved surplus an outdated vehicle and purchase of a new vehicle
- ✓ Discussed OR 47 realignment and Civic Building updates

OREGON22

July 15-24, [WCH Oregon22](#) will be held in Eugene at Hayward Field, at the University of Oregon. Marathons, race walks and community runs will be held at Autzen Stadium. This is a world wide event, with participants expected to visit throughout the state while they are here. About 25,000 people a day are expected to attend. While many are staying on campus or in Eugene, others will be traveling throughout the state.

Most construction and maintenance projects that could have major impacts on traffic headed to or attending Oregon22 are planning to pause during the event. Construction in other parts of the state will continue as scheduled, as will any emergency road repair projects.

Projects that will continue construction are aware of the potential increase in traffic and have planned accordingly.

Updates from ODOT

Curb Ramp Upgrades

Construction starts next week! There are 13 different intersections along OR 47 that will receive new curb ramps to meet current American with Disabilities Act (ADA) accessibility standards.

ODOT will construct the curb ramps in phases. This might *look* random, but they're starting with the locations that don't need right of way or have conflicts with the existing infrastructure – like utilities, sign poles, fire hydrants, etc.

They'll start with the OR 47 intersections at:

- W Johnson Street.
- W Harrison Street.
- W Cleveland Street.
- W Wilson Street.
- W Adams Street.

You can see these locations on the map marked with an orange traffic cone.
