

Elections

City Councilors are elected by their community to be representatives. A city councilor provides leadership and support for their community. One of the most important jobs of a council is to work closely with the administration of their city. They do this by making policy decisions for local issues, approving city budgets, proposing code updates and ordinances, and regulating health and safety issues, among a multitude of tasks.

The City of Carlton currently has 3 councilor at large positions open for this election cycle, which would start a 4-year term beginning January 1, 2023.
