As we begin to wander downtown to our favorite local businesses, please keep these city ordinances in mind to ensure safety and civility:

Do not obstruct building entrances, stairways or halls

 \checkmark Do not drive vehicles over sidewalks, unless there is an entrance ramp, incline or crossing provided for that purpose

 \checkmark Do not obstruct sidewalks or street crossings with objects or with groups of people

- ✓ Do not vend goods without a permit approved and issued by the City of Carlton
- ✓ Do not litter on the sidewalks, streets, parking, drinking fountains or in any public place; please use provided receptacles
- ✓ Do not make unnecessary, excessive or annoying noises that cause a disturbance or that exceed the commercial noise standards

Updates from ODOT

OR 47 Routine Maintenance Work

Last week our maintenance crew patched a section of OR 47 from approximately Grant Street to Wilson Street. The pavement along this section of road was rough, with cracking and some potholes. We patched the wheel tracks in this area to help prevent the road from getting worse over the fall and winter when it starts raining.

When it rains, the cracks and potholes fill with water. This deteriorates the pavement faster, causing more cracks and potholes.

During the winter months, it is very difficult to get the patching materials to stay in the potholes longer than a few days, creating an ongoing problem.



By patching this section during the warm summer months, the patching material is more likely to stay. This reduces the potential for an ongoing pothole problem, providing a smoother rider for travelers.

We'll be back in the next two to three weeks to patch a section of Yamhill Street.

- Be calm and wait to talk to them or someone when both are calm and in a stress free environment
- Be positive and use positive statements when talking to someone
 - Emphasize the benefits to quitting or using less
- Remind them that they are not alone and that there are lots of people that also struggle
 - with the same issues Give specific reasons why you have concerns
 - Offer to help in any way you can
- Be supportive and offer to make a call to help them as well as go with them as support

RADIO COMMUNICATION

Things to Remember:

- "Hey You its Me"
- Be an active listener
 - Pay attention to what is being said by others as it can affect you and keep your situational awareness up.
- Think about what you are going to say before you speak
- Use pain CLEAR English
- Be brief
- Press and hold the PTT button for a second or 2 before you speak.
- Give clear and concise directions. This ties back into think about what you are going to say before you say it.

Lastly Remember that what you say on the radio is heard by everyone and is recorded.
