## Curb Ramp Upgrades

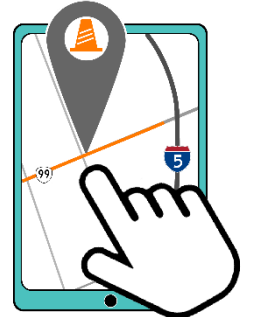
**Construction update!** Our crews have returned to Carlton to continue replacing curb ramps, making them ADA accessible.

## Code Corner

Code compliance and enforcement can seem a bit confusing, so we would like to explain the specific system that our City currently has in place.

As the City grows, we continue to receive more input from the community regarding Code Enforcement. Because of this, the city has increased efforts to address ADA Compliance, safety and walkability with more focused enforcement notifications and collaborative outreach.

We do our best to work with citizens under the parameters of the ordinances and strive to maintain a consistent approach and provide neutral responses. The system is complaint-based and a collaborative effort between city staff and citizens.

In several states and cities there are dedicated Code Enforcement Boards and officers. These municipalities usually employ systematic code enforcement programs. In others, such as the City of Carlton, City Staff and the Police Department work together to reach out and educate citizens on existing code in a complaint-based system. The goal of code enforcement is to educate, maintain community health and safety and provide citizens with a voice and the appropriate assistance to come into compliance with the law.

When the City is able to successfully work with property owners, the community benefits from the increased safety, beauty and value introduced with the adoption and compliance of city codes.

In the coming weeks we will go over the process for submitting complaints and receiving notifications.
