### Code Corner

In an effort to be outstanding neighbors and mindful citizens, the city asks that the community be aware of noise ordinances.

Citizens are asked to refrain from creating, assisting, or permitting loud, disturbing or unnecessary noise in the city of Carlton. Some specific examples include:

- Animals that make frequent noise
- → Unnecessarily loud vehicles due to disrepair or modification
- → Demolition, repair of buildings or construction after seven p.m. or before seven a.m. (unless granted a special permit) weekdays and seven p.m. or before eight a.m. on Saturdays
- → Sirens or horns outside of emergency vehicles or necessary warning of danger to others
- → Noise amplification devices that disturb others in the vicinity outside of permitted events and gatherings (speakers, radios, microphones, etc.)

Some uses and activities are exempt from noise level regulations:

- Properly functioning-
- o Air-conditioning equipment
- o Lawn maintenance equipment
- o Nonamplified noises from authorized planned events
- o Noncommercial speaking and public assemblies in public spaces between 7am 11pm
- Recreational and educational activities (school bands, neighborhood ball games)
- o Agricultural activities
- Public utility and facilities maintenance
- Safety, warning and emergency signals
