

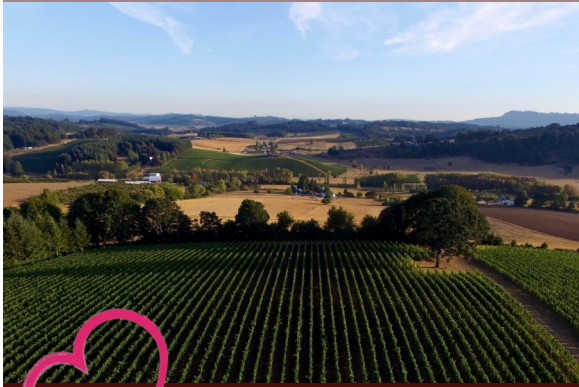

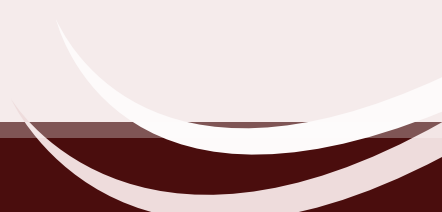
City Hall has Moved!

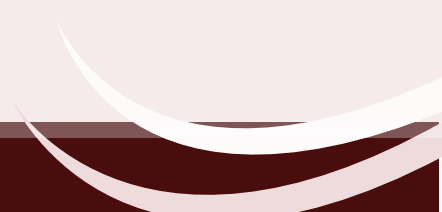

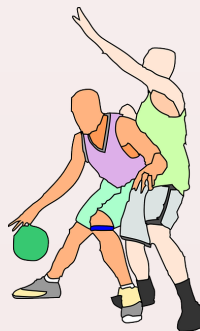
Code Corner



This week let's review some information about the City of Carlton's Municipal Code as it relates to basketball hoops:

The City Code does not allow items that obstruct the street or sidewalk. Unless written permission is obtained from the marshal, citizens and businesses may not park, place or leave anything that, in any way, impedes the traffic, pedestrian flow, or obstructs the view upon any street, alley, parking strip, sidewalk, or curb of the city. Remember to return basketball hoops onto your property after use in the street to accommodate for this ordinance.

Carlton Police Department Makes Arrest for Restraining Order Violation, Stalking Order Violation, Criminal Conspiracy of C Felony, in addition to other charges

On February 7, at about 5:30 p.m., Carlton Police arrested 43-year-old, Carlton resident, Anthony Joseph Thompson without incident. Thompson will be arraigned on February 9, 2023, for the following charges:

INVESTIGATION 1
Criminal Conspiracy of C Felony
Solicitation of C Felony
Attempted Theft 1

The Carlton Police Department began an investigation related to a traffic accident that occurred on December 23, 2022. Thompson was cited for careless driving and driving uninsured as a result of the initial investigation. It was later learned that Thompson had tried to get the other parties related to the accident to provide false information related to the reporting of the accident. Thompson was subsequently arrested on February 7, 2023.

INVESTIGATION 2
Violation of a Stalking Order
Endangering Person Protected by FAPA Order
Reckless Endangering Another

On January 26, 2023, Carlton Police Department conducted another investigation regarding Thompson in relationship to a restraining order and stalking order violation.

During the investigation it was learned that Thompson, while operating his own vehicle, had rapidly approached the victim's vehicle from behind while flashing his high beams.

He then subsequently passed the victim's vehicle unsafely in a school crossing /no passing zone intersection. Thompson violated the conditions of two restraining orders and a stalking order as a result of his actions.

On January 27, 2023, Carlton Officers responded to Thompson's residence and found him sitting in his vehicle in front of his residence. Officers told Thompson that he was under arrest and that if he ran he would be charged with escape. Thompson subsequently ran from officers yelling for the Officers to charge him with escape.

On February 7, 2023, Officer Mich Steeves arrested Thompson at the conclusion of a trial at that Yamhill County Courthouse without incident. Thompson was appearing at the trial as a defendant on an unrelated case involving the same victim.

Thompson will be arraigned on February 9, 2023, regarding the new charges.

The Carlton Police Department urges victims, witnesses and citizens that have information about release agreement, restraining order violations, or stalking order violations to report them as soon as possible to law enforcement. This cooperative effort between police and citizens minimizes the potential for victims to repeatedly be placed in harm's way. Protection orders are intended to help protect the victim and minimize future crimes against them.

Store Clerk Indicted for Aggravated Theft in the First Degree

On May 9, 2022, Carlton Police Department began an investigation involving the theft of a large amount of money from the Main Street Market in the City of Carlton.

During the investigation it was discovered that a clerk, Aubrie Jo Ivie, had stolen an estimated \$50,000 or more from the local business during her approximately 11-month span of employment.

After an extensive investigation by the Carlton Police Department in cooperation with the Oregon State Police and the Oregon Lottery. On February 1, 2023, a Yamhill County Jury indicted Ivie on the following charges:

Aggravated Theft in the First Degree (B Felony)
Theft 1 x2 (C Felony)
Theft 2 (A Misdemeanor)

On February 8, 2023, at about 3 p.m. Officers from the Carlton Police arrested Ivie without incident and transported her to the Yamhill County Correctional Facility where she was lodged on the aforementioned charges.

Felony Driving under the influence and Felony Driving while Suspended Arrest

On February 1, 2023, at approximately 5:00 PM, Carlton officers were dispatched a reckless drive where the caller reported that the driver had driven into the ditch multiple times when driving to Carlton from outside of McMinnville.

Senior Officer Jake Blair located the driver and observed that the driver appeared to be driving while under the influence of intoxicates (DUI) and began a DUI investigation and subsequently learned that the driver, 30-year-old Sean Davis out of McMinnville was also driving while suspended at a felony level due to multiple previous DUI convictions. At the end of the investigation, Senior Officer Blair arrested Sean for DUI - Felony, Driving while Suspended - Felony, and lodged him at the Yamhill County Correctional Facility.

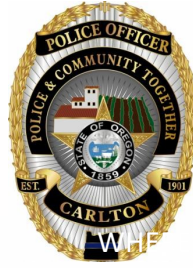
