
We are open Monday through Friday from 8am-4pm

Out & About

On March 14, 2023, a Carlton Officer was conducting a foot patrol of the Upper and discovered that one of the bathrooms at the Upper Park had been vandalized. An officer later located damaged trees in the Upper and Lower Park. Carlton Officers quickly began two investigations and learned that a couple juveniles had used a machete, hatchet and knives to cause the damage. Carlton Officers subsequently arrested the juveniles and lodged them at the Yamhill County Juvenile Detention for multiple counts of criminal mischief charges.

The Carlton Police Department encourages citizens that if they see something occurring or something suspicious to report it to the Carlton Police Department immediately, "If you see something, say something."

On March 17, 2023, Carlton Officers responded to a call where a dog had escaped from its home and went to another property and had attacked multiple sheep. The attack left multiple sheep with serious injuries and also displayed an aggressive, hostile demeanor to the sheep owner. When Carlton Officers arrive on scene, the dog was very hostile and barking at officers and had blood on its mouth. The Carlton Officers were able to de-escalate the dog's aggression with the help of a nearby resident who provided food and water until the dog's owner could be located. Carlton Police Department was able to locate the dog's owner, who responded to the scene and took possession of the dog. Subsequently the dog's owner was subsequently cited for the following: Dog as public nuisance, Dog at large, Dog not licensed.

The Carlton Police Department has responded to several dog at large calls over the last week. Due to the amount of time it takes to locate owners for dog at large calls or incidents like this, it is likely that owners may receive a citation at the very least for dog at large. Trying to track down an owner can be very time consuming and tie up officers for extended periods of time. Due to the nature of the most recent incident and the potential of harm to community members and their animals, it is critical that dog owners ensure control and containment of their canine pets at all times.

On March 22, 2023, Officer Steeves was conducting a foot patrol of the upper park, when he met 3-year-old Clara. Officer Steeves gave Clara a Carlton police sticker and a teddy bear and she immediately started hugging the teddy bear and absolutely loved it. Clara told Officer Steeves that her teddy bear was "super shy". Officer Steeves found out that Clara had never seen a police car up close and he gave her the grand tour of his patrol car. Clara had the biggest smile when she was allowed to turn on the emergency lights! Clara absolutely loved the experience!

Code Corner

Our code compliance team works hard to resolve code complaints. Below, you will find a list of last month's code violations and their status.

This week let's review some information about the City of Carlton's Municipal Code as it relates to right of way and clear vision obstruction:

The City Code does not allow items that obstruct the street or sidewalk, this includes basketball hoops, vehicles, trailers, firewood, bicycles, toys and any other items that cause impediment to traffic and pedestrian flow.

Unless written permission is obtained from the marshal, citizens and businesses may not park, place or leave anything that, in any way, impedes the traffic, pedestrian flow, or obstructs the view upon any street, alley, parking strip, sidewalk, or curb of the city. Remember to keep the right of way and street clear and to remove any items promptly if temporary placement is necessary.
