

Code Corner

Whether you have visitors, an additional vehicle or landscape management parking in the right of way at your property please remind everyone to observe the following parking rules:

- → Vehicles must be parked in the direction they would be proceeding upon the street
- ★ Recreational Vehicles may not be parked on public streets and may not be occupied on private property overnight without an approved permit
- → In areas where mode of parking is not indicated, vehicles must park within twelve inches and parallel to the curb
- → Owners must immediately move vehicles which are blocking emergency access for the fire department
- → A vehicle may not be parked in the same place on a public street for more than seventy-two (72) consecutive hours
- → Vehicles may not park in such a way as to impede traffic or obstruct the traffic view or sidewalk

DON'T FALL VICTIM TO A SCAM

The Carlton Police Department would like to remind citizens to protect themselves from scams and fraud. Scams are out there and can affect anyone, this can be over the phone, email, mail, in person, through social media and through many other methods. Scammers may ask for your personal information, bank account info, or ask you to pay them in various "secure methods" such as through purchasing gift cards, pre-paid debit cards, crypto currencies such as "Bitcoin" or through mailing checks or money orders. Scammers may even tell you that they work for government agencies such as the FBI, local law enforcement, border control, or local businesses. They may even give you contact information for their managers, who are also posing as fictious people trying to scam you.

To protect yourself, make sure you know who you are talking to, confirm who they are by calling the local number for that business or agency, do not open any suspicious texts, links, or popup windows. Do not give out your personal details to people that you do not know, and be aware of offers that seem too good to be true.
