

Code Corner

Back yard burning *is not recommended* in compact housing developments and within city limits.

Please consider the following alternatives to open burning:

- Recycle paper products when possible
- Dispose of waste at a landfill
- Compost yard debris and kitchen scraps
- Reuse old lumber
- Buy a chipper and use chips for mulch and compost.
- Work with neighbors to organize a neighborhood cleanup day.
 Take hazardous materials, including oil-based paints, solvents, garden chemicals and car fluids to a hazardous waste collection site. Burning these materials is illegal and extremely dangerous

Recreation fires such as camp-fires, open cooking or warming fires are allowed year round and must be:

- Small
- Smaller than 3 feet in diameter and 2 feet high
- Burn only dry, cut firewood

When using outdoor cooking equipment follow all safety protocols and be aware of potential fire hazards.
