KEEPING YOU IN-THE-KNOW ABOUT WHAT IS HAPPENING IN OUR COMMUNITY



Due to some scheduling changes, ODOT ADA ramp work downtown will begin after the Memorial Day Weekend. Work will occur during the day on weekdays. Please watch for flaggers on Main Street and single lane closures during daytime construction hours. Both lanes will be opened back up during non-construction hours.

#### Ramps Estimated to Completed by May 30th & June 2nd

- SE corner of Main St & Yamhill St
- Ladd Park ramps
- SE corner of Main St & Park St

Unless something unexpected is encountered, it is anticipated that ramps will be demoed and formed in one day, and concrete poured on the second day. Pedestrian access will typically be available back on day three. We will keep you updated as we get more information.



### Code Corner

Firework sales are just around the corner, please review the below ORS and Municipal Code guidelines prior to use:

- Fireworks must be purchased from a permitted retail sales location and may NOT be purchased from another state
- Oregon law prohibits the possession, use, or sale of any firework that flies into the air, explodes, or travels more than 12 feet horizontally on the ground without a permit issued by the OSFM
- Those who misuse fireworks or allow fireworks to cause damage are liable and may be required to pay fire suppression costs or other damage. Parents are also liable for fireworks damage caused by their children

The City of Carlton does not currently have a local ban on fireworks, however, the following ordinances may apply:

- Every substance, thing, or act determined to be injurious or detrimental to the public health safety, or welfare of the city may be abated
- No person shall make, assist in making, or permit any loud, disturbing or unnecessary noise which either annoys, disturbs, injures or endangers the comfort, repose, health, safety or peace of others

In the event of dry conditions increasing the risk of fires, the city may request that citizens refrain from using fireworks until conditions improve.

## **Out & About**



Over the last several years, the amount of police time spent investigating crimes and offenses caused by juveniles has been overwhelming. Most of these crimes include: theft, criminal mischief, burglaries, disorderly conduct, trespassing, graffiti and curfew violations.

Due to the amount of time it takes to investigate these crimes and offenses, it puts a strain on our officers' abilities to maintain a good balance of proactive-prevention-policing efforts within our community. Juvenile investigations often require tracking down video footage from residents and then reviewing that footage, which takes up a lot of officer time. Typically, numerous interviews are conducted which can also be very time-consuming.

In an effort to reduce the impact of juvenile related issues, the Carlton Police Department is reaching out to our parents to help from a proactive approach. By knowing what your children are doing and where they are, could not only keep them safe, but also free up police resources to help and/or deter more serious and problematic situations in our community. Part of the Carlton Police Department's effort to help reduce juvenile crimes is to share with parents/legal guardians the consequences that they may be subject to, based on the actions of their child or minor dependent. When a minor has committed a crime or offense, they will be referred to the Yamhill County Juvenile Department. In the case of certain crimes, the minor will be lodged at the Yamhill County Juvenile Detention Center in McMinnville. If a parent is cited for failing to supervise a child, they would be cited to appear in either the Carlton Municipal Court or the Yamhill County Circuit Court.

The following link to the Oregon Revised Statute provides what actions a parent or legal guardian may be subject to.

ORS 163.577 - Failing to supervise a child (public.law)
