August 2023

Trees surveyed to date: 9,407 (95% are trees in Washington County)

of trees with confirmed EAB presence: 130

Square miles known to be infested with EAB: 2.9

In this issue:

- *EAB found in ash trees in Cornelius*
- *Most calls to the state's invasive species hotline are look-alikes*
- *Peak emergence of EAB adults has passed*
- *No EAB found so far in traps in outlying counties*

EAB confirmed in ash trees at two Cornelius parks

The Oregon Dept. of Agriculture (ODA) has confirmed the presence of emerald ash borer in ash trees in two parks in Cornelius, a community of over 13,000 people in Washington County just east of Forest Grove. Both parks are less than two miles from the site in Forest Grove where EAB was first discovered in June 2022. Tarrybrooke and Harleman parks are only about a quarter of a mile apart on the city's westside. The presence of EAB in ash trees in those parks is not unexpected given the closeness to the first site reported last year. Cornelius residents, like the rest of Washington County, are already under a wood quarantine to help slow the spread of EAB to areas outside the county.

- We are half way through August and the raw water storage at Panther Creek Reservoir is adequate and we have good quality of untreated available for the remainder of the summer
- Water meter flow tests were conducted this week on the system's largest consumers

Sewer

- The headworks project is coming along nicely—forms for the channel connection are being worked on
- Hawn Creek Pump Station is almost ready to close out
- Power supply upgrade for the park is in design phase
- Lagoon levels are good for August

The City of Carlton is fortunate to contract the services of a city sweeper who goes through the residential and commercial areas the first Tuesday of each month. While they are there to sweep away debris that falls into the right of way, please keep in mind they are not able to remove debris on or originating from private property.

Residents placing yard debris in the street and right of way creates obstructions and public safety issues. If you are looking to dispose of yard debris please get in contact with Recology and ask them about yard debris bins as an add on service for property owners in the City of Carlton. As our citizens continue gardening, landscaping or maintenance consider using a debris bin to safely dispose of lawn clippings and other landscaping debris.
