

## Safe Driving Tips

- "Cover the brake" at intersections
- 2. Practice "when/then" thinking and mental imagery to prepare to respond to events that occur on the roadway.
- 3. Scan using the 3-Second Rule
- 4. Manage your vehicle spacing
- 5. Check your tire pressure
- 6. Think twice before speeding
- 7. Adjust your speed before curves
- 8. TRAIN, TRAIN, TRAIN



## **Defensive Driving Behaviors**

- Look ahead at oncoming traffic and make eye contact with drivers
- 2. Be aware of traffic to the side of you when passing a vehicle or being passed
- 3. Avoid aggressive driving
- 4. Leave sufficient space between you and the vehicles in front and behind
  - Follow the 3-second rule
- 5. Increase 3-second rule in inclement weather, at night, or when following trucks or motorcycles
- 6. Always wear your seatbelt
- 7. Be aware of your surroundings pay attention to everything around you
- 8. Check mirrors regularly, always keep your eyes moving
- 9. Stay back from individuals driving aggressively or erratically
- 10. Watch for pedestrians, cyclists, motorcycles, and animals
- 11. Never assume other drivers will stop at lights, give you the right of way, or allow you to merge
- 12. Plan your actions for the worst-case scenario
- 13. Control your speed and adjust for road conditions and traffic


- 14. Plan an escape route to avoid potential dangers
- 15. Drive and position your vehicle so that you're visible to other vehicles and can see other vehicles, as well
- 16. Eliminate driving distractions
- 17. Stay focused when you drive
- 18. Avoid driving when fatigued
- 19. Do not drive when impaired by drugs, alcohol, prescription medication, lack of sleep, etc.
- 20. Avoid passing trucks on the right or left side when they're turning
- 21. Don't drive next to semis (especially long-load trucks)
  - If you're passing on multiple lane freeway, wait to be sure you have a clear area to pass
- 22. Reconsider driving in adverse weather conditions such as ice and snow
  - Always check the traffic or road reports prior to starting out on your trip
  - Consider staying overnight if the roads are not in good condition
- 23. Always look ahead and to the sides for potholes, dead animals, road debris, etc. that would cause damage to your vehicle and possibly cause injury to you
