account at the time the letter is sent. The letter states that water service will be disconnected unless the delinquent amount is paid by 8:30 am on the specified date of the month. The written notice must include the date of shut-off, the amount of delinquent charges, and the time period allowed for payment to avoid disconnection of service.

- Past due bills not paid by 8:30 am on the specified date will be shut-off.
- A disconnection fee in the amount of \$45 will be charged.
- 5. Bills must be paid in full in order for service to be restored

Section 3: Deposits. The Council hereby authorizes staff to collect utility deposits on new accounts in the amount of \$150. Refunds will be given in the following manner (without interest):

- · Homeowners that have good credit after 18 months
- Renters: after deposits are applied to the final billing which results in a credit balance

Section 4: Charges for Time and Material. The City departments are hereby authorized to charge the responsible party for personnel, equipment, vehicles, materials, supplies and overhead for services provided by the City to repair or maintain city utility lines, mains, service lines, water meters, water meter boxes or other utility property that has been destroyed or damaged.

In 2015 The City entered into a contract with Deb Galardi Consulting to review and make recommendations regarding the City's water system service rates and attributes. Based on her analysis, the City adopted a revised schedule of the existing monthly water charges based on meter size and a consumption charge per 100 cubic feet. The outside City rate was adjusted to be more equitable across customers with a 3-year phase in period. Previous to this new methodology, the last significant increase of 11% was in 2012 for debt services.
